

Greetings Rising Tide Owners,

Summer is upon us in full force here in the store! If you have been in recently, you know that things are hopping. We are breaking customer and sales records, and fresh local produce is bursting from our shelves. It is a wonderful time to be in Maine! We are grateful that our community and our visitors want to support the products and services that we offer. As a business committed to our local community and guided by a mission, Ends Statement, and cooperative principles, Rising Tide is delivering a model that offers hope and stability in a time of great transition and challenges. Clearly, people are eager to participate in this dynamic approach to the food economy.

Cooperatives have often been the stabilizing business model for people to control access to products and services and keep resources in their community. In 2021, Rising Tide did just that. We spent \$1,112,973 on Maine products, paid employees \$2,029,220 in wages and benefits, utilized local service providers for \$229,686, and made \$17,164 in donations to local organizations. For every dollar spent at Rising Tide, \$.36 stayed in Maine. That amount does not include taxes paid to Maine and Damariscotta, or the discounts and dividends that support our owners.

We are lucky that a group of neighbors had the foresight in 1978 to establish this co-op. Rising Tide is an anchor and a catalyst for a strong local economy that benefits the whole. We have provided the space for local vendors to make their first sales, some of them growing to span multiple states in their distribution. More than 300 Maine vendors are represented on our shelves and that number is growing. We are supporting solutions to a complex distribution challenge, and providing access to food that is grown and controlled by our neighbors. Our work together contributed to livable wages for Maine producers and their families.

Rising Tide is dedicated to aligning our policies with the constantly evolving world around us. Last year, we used strategic planning sessions with the management team and board to discuss how to incorporate environmental and social justice commitments that guide our decision making at all levels of the store. We offered workshops for all staff and board members with EqualityMaine and conducted a member-owner survey to assess priorities from a member-owners' perspective. We also have a dozen staff participating in a national Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) training that will be the foundation for ongoing discussions and development of a vision forward.

For me, this work is deeply rewarding. I do it because I want to help build a sustainable food system that promotes a just world. This is complex and means different things to different people, but at Rising Tide it is about using natural, organic and local food as a vehicle for positive change.

Thank you for being my partner in this important work.



**Net Income -** The profit after all expenses.

Why did it drop so significantly from 2020? It's multifaceted, and here are the primary reasons.

- In 2020, Rising Tide benefited from receiving a \$279,000 Payroll Protection Plan Loan as part of federal Covid relief. The entire loan was forgiven, thus providing that additional "income" to 2020.
- Rising Tide spent much of 2020 short staffed resulting, even with storewide wage increases, hero pay, and profit sharing, in smaller overall personnel expenses in 2020 than 2019. In 2021, not only did the store begin to return to proper staffing levels, but employees on average

the store made a foundational increase to a \$15/hour store minimum wage. As our second largest single area of expense, personnel increases were a critical investment that impacted the bottom line.

# Supporting the Local Food Economy

#### What difference does it make?

The following list represents the 2021 payments that Rising Tide made to our Top Ten, of nearly 300, individual Maine producers -- the top three are in Lincoln County. These farms and producers, in turn, support employees and the broader local economy.

- Cost of Goods Sold increased at a .4% faster rate than did our sales, not surprising with the impacts of inflation and distribution challenges.
- Over \$100,000 was also spent to address failures with aging equipment.

## **7 Cooperative Principles**

Cooperatives have been around for hundreds of years, since Benjamin Franklin formed the first mutual insurance company in Philadelphia. We believe in seven basic principles and these principles are the foundation for Rising Tide Co-op.

### 1 Open & Voluntary Membership

Membership in a cooperative is open to all persons who can reasonably use its services and stand willing to accept the responsibilities of membership, regardless of race, religion, gender, or economic circumstances.

#### 2 Democratic Member Control

Cooperatives are democratic organizations controlled by their members, who actively participate in setting policies and making decisions, electing representatives (directors/trustees) and are accountable to the membership. In primary cooperatives, members have equal voting rights (one member, one vote).

#### 3 Member Economic Participation

Members contribute equitably to, and democratically control the capital of their cooperative. Members allocate surpluses for any or all of the following purposes: developing the cooperative; setting up reserves; benefiting members in proportion to their transactions with the cooperative; and supporting other activities.

#### 4 Autonomy & Independence

Cooperatives are autonomous, self-help organizations controlled by their members. If they enter into agreements with other organizations, including governments, or raise capital from external sources, they do so on terms that ensure democratic control as well as their unique identity.

#### 5 Education, Training & Information

Education and training for members, elected representatives (directors/trustees) CEO's, and employees help to effectively contribute to the development of cooperatives. Communications about the nature and benefits of cooperatives particularly with the general public and opinion leaders, helps boost cooperatives.

#### 6 Cooperation among cooperatives

By working together through local, national, regional, and international structures, cooperatives improve services, bolster local economies, and deal more effectively with social and community needs.

#### 7 Concern for Community

Cooperatives work for the sustainable development of their communities through policies supported by their memberships.
